Transfer Radicalization Approaches in Training

Newsletter - 6th April 2019

Next Monday, 8th April, the “*Radicalizations*” training course shall be organized at the Juvenile Justice Center’s *Auditorium*, of Calabria, (47, via F. Paglia) by the General Directorate of Training (DAP) of Rome in collaboration with the Juvenile Justice Center and the Probation office of Catanzaro. This is one of the training actions of the European project “TRAIIn Training”. This training course is addressed to probation practitioners (working with juveniles and young adults). The director of Calabria’s Juvenile Justice Center, Miss Isabella Mastropasqua and the director of Catanzaro’s Probation Office, Ms. Emilio Molinari will be present. The President of Catanzaro’s Juvenile Court, Miss Teresa Chiodo, and the public prosecutor of Catanzaro Juvenile Court, Miss Maria Alessendra Ruperto will attend the event.

This training path was born from the need to broaden the knowledge on juvenile deviance phenomenon characterized by “radicalization”, with reference to, but not exclusively to, jihadist radicalization, through learning and sharing useful cognitive tools, through theoretical reflections, analysis of case-studies and experiences and practices exchange. The aim is to strengthen and manage the interventions and the networks between probation, prison and civil society. Such capillary work, carried out in the community, will encourage the rethinking of intervention practices in the services, in the light of sharing evidences, asking possible responses that the social work, the psychological and educational approach are called out to put in place to give back to everyone a hope of growth and reintegration.

The training course will take place from 8 to 10 April 2019. Among the teachers: Mr Nicola di Mauro (University L’Orientale, Naples) who will talk about the Syllabus drafted, among the project’s tools, to make Islam known; Mr. Francesco Marone (University of Pavia) who will report on the case studies of biographies of juveniles involved in jihadist radical deviances; Mr Franco Prina (University of Turin) who will give a lecture on the “radical” forms of youth deviances, highlighting the tools (expressions, favoring factors, strategies and interventions) for understanding radicalization risks.

It is increasingly complex, for those who are working in the psycho-socio-educational field, in particular for the Territorial Services of the world of Justice in contact with juvenile offenders or young adults, to identify the different forms of 'radicalism' and 'radicalization' currently emerging from the evolution of youth deviance phenomena.

In recent decades, in fact, in addition to the radicalization of 'jihadist' nature - that raises strong concern and requires immediate interventions aimed at making society safe, due to the violence and unpredictability of its manifestations - other deviant approaches and trends, connoted by the 'radicalization', are being transformed and consolidated, with often negative and criminal characteristics and consequences towards individuals and communities - but also sometimes towards themselves - that confuse professionals in the sector by challenging traditional social and pedagogical skills acquired over the years.

This training course - one of the actions of the wider European "TRAIIn TRAINING" project - stems from the need to expand knowledge on the phenomenon, acquiring and sharing useful knowledge and management tools for the phenomena of youthful deviance, characterized by 'radicalizations', with reference to jihadist radicalization, but not only, through theoretical reflections, case study analysis and exchange of experiences and practices, also in order to strengthen the networks between external, internal and civil society criminal areas.

This capillary work, carried out in the territorial context, will facilitate the rethinking of intervention practices in the Services, in the light of the shared evidence, and question the possible responses that social work, the psychological and educational approach are called to implement, however, to give back everyone hope for growth and reintegration.

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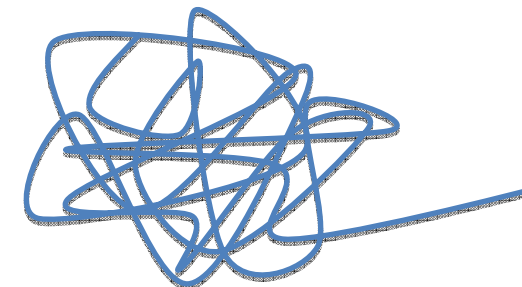
